Appointment of Auxiliary Bishop For the Diocese of Hamilton

His Grace, Archbishop Luigi Bonazzi, Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, has announced that **Reverend Father Wayne Lobsinger** has been appointed Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Hamilton by His Holiness Pope Francis. Since being ordained by Bishop Tonnos in 1994, Auxiliary Bishop-Elect Lobsinger has served as an Associate Pastor and Pastor in many Parishes throughout the Diocese. In addition, he has served on the Diocesan College of Consultors, the Episcopal Board, Canadian Federation of Presbyteral Councils, Chairman of the Diocesan Council of Priests, Chaplain for the Legion of Mary and Spiritual Director at St. Peter's Seminary, London. The Episcopal ordination is expected to take place at the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King, Hamilton, in early February 2021.

Journey Through Advent Video Series




On Monday, November 23 2020 the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) announced a new online weekly video series created to help Canadian Catholic faithful to prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Entitled *Journey through Advent*, the series is a joint project involving the CCCB's *Office national de liturgie*, the National Liturgy Office, and the Office for Evangelization and Catechesis. The initiative was developed as a way, through the modern method of video messaging, to offer a resource that enriches faith formation during a time of joyful anticipation for the coming of the Lord and Saviour into the world.

The videos serve as an introduction to the liturgical Season and present reflections on the Gospel readings for each Sunday in Advent. The Most Reverend Douglas Crosby, O.M.I., Bishop of Hamilton and the Most Reverend Pierre Goudreault, Bishop of Saint-Anne-de-la-Pocatière, provide spiritual and pastoral guidance on the readings that illustrate the true meaning of Christmas.

This video series is especially relevant given the COVID-19 pandemic that places limitations on in-person gatherings for faith communities. It is hoped that *Journey through Advent* will be a source of deep spiritual solace and insightful preparation for all. The videos will be available on the CCCB website each Monday in advance of the upcoming Sunday celebration (23 November, 30 November 7 December and 14 December).

Compassionate Care Ministry

Pastoral Care of the Elderly, Sick, Hospitalized or Homebound

Compassionate Care Ministry offers healing love to all, especially the sick, elderly, isolated and lonely members of a parish. It involves outreach, which can occur in a variety of ways, to remind those served that they matter and that their parish family cares for them.



When: Three one-hour seminars: Thursday, January 14, 21 & 28. From 2 -3 P.M. each day.

Who: Priests, deacons, lay staff, parish nurses and/or volunteers at the Parish who may engage in or lead Compassionate Care Ministry.

What: A chance to discern and learn about 'Compassionate Care Ministry' and what it might look like at your parish.



These are not training sessions, but they will provide an overview of multiple ways in which as parish might engage in some form of compassionate care ministry for the vulnerable in a parish.

Attendees will learn about both the pros and cons of engagement in this type of ministry, as well as the various possibilities you might employ to begin. In addition, they will understand what is necessary to provide for a ministry that is both safe and efficient.



An overview of how to gather a team of parishioners to engage in Compassionate Care Ministry and find a good leader for the team will be presented, as well as the necessary requirements for proper training and screening.

Practical components involved in training a team will also be discussed. For example: Engaging in conversation, respecting boundaries, engaging in prayer, proper form for Eucharist distribution outside of the Mass setting, to name a few.

"If a disciple stays still and doesn't go out and does not give back to others what he has received in Baptism, he is not a true disciple of Jesus. He lacks the missionary [spirit]; he can't get out of himself [to be able] to bring something good to others" (Pope Francis)
