



To the Members of SSVP Saint Joseph - Fergus

Once again, we at the Centre Wellington Food Bank thank you for your generosity and your solid support, especially during one of the toughest years that all of us have had to face during this pandemic.

I am overwhelmed by the support you have provided in making sure all the families and individuals we support receive those basic necessities of life we take for granted. Over the past dozen years the Food Bank has invited you and others to our AGM to not just thank you but also to recognize your support through an award. This year that was not possible of course but I want to stress the fact that your support is never taken lightly and as a result we plan on honoring you next year at our 2021 AGM.

It has been a hectic year but we have undertaken all kinds of wonderful, ground-breaking new programs and initiatives and I would love to share some of these with you here.

First of all, we have increased the production of our home-made meals that our shoppers can take home and enjoy at their leisure. This includes a great variety of healthy and fun-to-eat dishes like soups, stews and sauces which are safely stored and served at our soup station. Our members can help themselves to these foods and take them home to their families.

In 2020 we piloted two new cooking programs . . . one focusing on children ages 6-8 and the other on seniors 65+. Only 5 food banks from across the province were chosen by Food Banks Canada to carry out these projects and we were the first to be asked. This we could never have achieved without your generous support.





Without a doubt the most important new initiative this year has been our continued leadership in moving our community towards food rescue and recovery. This initiative all started years ago by Little Caesars Pizza in Fergus and has expanded to include rescuing food from several KFC franchises here and in Guelph and many of our local grocers in Elora and Fergus, including

FreschCo and Zehrs, have also come on board. However this year the most significant food rescue partner has been Walmart Canada. From this <u>one</u> retailer in our community we rescue over 4,000 pounds a week of unwanted, not-selling, close-to-expiry foods and foods in damaged packaging. What a windfall for the food bank and the people we support! And once again, this could never have happened without your support and the community's support and for this we truly thank you.
