In 1833, a brilliant young law student in Paris named Frederic Ozanam was so appalled by the conditions of the poor that he and about 6 other students formed a society dedicated to meeting the needs of the poor with food, clothing, comfort and spiritual guidance.

The St. Vincent de Paul Society spread at an incredible rate and now functions in more than 120 countries around the world. About the years 1999-2000 a conference was established in the parishes of Fergus / Elora dedicated to helping anyone in need without regard to colour, race, religion.

These past two years and some, as you know, have been very challenging! We have had to come up with innovative ways of continuing Frederick Ozanam's work. We were fortunate to have been able to make arrangements with the Food Bank to hand out our food vouchers. Instead of home visits we have been making phone visits to all our clients. We bring the vouchers to the Food Bank and the clients are instructed to go and pick them up. We hope to be able to resume home visits in the Fall, depending on the situation with Covid.

You, the parishioners of St Joseph and of St. Mary have been extremely generous, amid these difficult times and we thank you most sincerely! In 2021, you have given us a total amount of \$31,434.35 for which we are very grateful and appreciative!

We have made phone calls to 82 homes with a total of 56 children.

We paid out in food vouchers for a total of \$13,077.48 (Zehrs and Freshco)

Personal hygiene items to Food Bank \$517.96

Particular Council in Guelph \$2,500.00

Guelph Homeless (Stepping Stone) \$773.85 winter clothing

Autism Program in Fergus \$2,000.00

Mission Store, furniture for clients \$484.72

We also pay a share of our collection to the governing body of St. Vincent de Paul Council in Guelph, \$2,064.00

Alzeimers Society \$200.00

Back rent for a client \$3,300

Food Bank donation \$500.00 for cereal and \$100.00 to a needy family for clothes

Coats for adults \$1,364.70

Periodically, Father Ken and Father Emmanuel from Elora help transient people in need of food, we issued them gift cards for \$100.00 from Tim Horton.

We mailed out 40 vouchers valued at \$100.00 each to our regular clients at Christmas.

At this time, we would like to thank Al Evans, Leo Givens and Martin Saunders who are no longer active. Their many years of service and dedication to our Society have been much appreciated. The members of our two parishes are a vibrant group, however, we are ageing faster than we would like to and therefore some of us are slowing down mentally and especially physically. Blame it on Covid! We have lost two active members due to them relocating elsewhere. If we are to resume Home Visits in the Fall, we are sincerely appealing to our fellow parishioners, who may be newly retired or anyone else that can fit in some time in, to consider joining us to ensure the continuation of the work that Brother Ozanam began in 1833. We meet every last Wednesday of the month at 4:00 P.M. in the Parish Hall. If you are interested, you can speak with me after Mass, or contact the church secretary between 9:00 and 5:00 Monday to Thursday and she will put you in contact with someone in the group.

We sincerely ask that you keep us in your prayers that we may continue our work with humility and compassion for our clients.
