From the Pastor's Desk



In 2010, auto manufacturers recalled a staggering 20 million car in the US for various defects. The thought of such a large number of defective cars on the road is startling enough. Yet, what is more disturbing is the apathy of some owners. In one instance, the executive director of the Centre for Auto Safety warned owners, "It is free repair. Get it done. It may save your life." Despite the risk to their own lives, 30% never responded.

Likewise, many ignore God's 'recall notice' to the entire human race. Unlike a defect found in automobiles, the moral defect of the human race is not the Heavenly Maker's fault. God made everything very "good" (Genesis 1:31), but our sins ruined it. God's offer to us is simple, "*repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out.*" (Acts 3:19) God offers not just a free repair of the human heart but a replacement heart. "*A new heart I will give you and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.*" (Ezekiel 36:26) Though the offer costs us nothing, it cost God the life of God's only Son Jesus. "[Jesus] himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, that we, free from sins, might live for righteousness; by his wounds [we] have been healed." (1 Peter 2:24)

Summer is over, now is the time to start anew. Unlike many car owners, let us not ignore The Lord's 'recall notice' any longer. The free and permanent remedy offered by our Heavenly Maker for our spiritual defect(s) will save our life. For a new start, let us ask God for a new heart. It is free! Jesus already paid the price!
