From the Pastor's Desk

Daniel Cellucci, CEO of the Catholic Leadership Institute, shared a story of one of his many trips. He goes on to ask us how we might react if we were in the Exit Row? Mr. Cellucci recalled, "I need a verbal confirmation that you are willing and able." That is the request when you sit in an Exit Row on an airplane. Getting the Exit Row seat can be an essential survival strategy for someone who is often on a plane. On a flight to Chicago, he was struck when he was asked that question and the insistence with which the flight attendant waited for him to say 'yes' at six in the morning.

The reality is the Exit Row is an others-focused seat. In the event of an emergency, you are taking responsibility for others. "I can guarantee you," he reported, "I didn't choose the seat for the sake of the person sitting behind me. But, in taking the seat, I said 'yes' to sacrifice for others."

His Holiness Pope Francis reminds us that "mercy does not just mean being a 'good person' nor is it mere sentimentality. It is the measure of our authenticity as disciples of Jesus."

It struck Mr. Cellucci that we are always, especially these days, being asked to 'give a confirmation' of just how 'authentically' our discipleship extends past ourselves. We are a journey of faith together. "*If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it.*" (1 Corinthians 12:26) It is okay to enjoy the extra legroom, but let us hope that today and every day we live up to the 'yes' we give and not just in case of an emergency!
