From the Pastor's Desk

Please give our Diocesan Bishop, Bishop Crosby, a warm welcome as he celebrates the 9:00 a.m. Mass this weekend for my formal installation as Pastor. Ad moltos annos.

In 1815 Napoléon was leading the French toward domination of Europe. During the Battle of Waterloo, he led his army against the British, Dutch and German Allies under the command of Wellington. The people of England depended on a system of signal stations to find out how the battle was going. A man at each station would spell out words by using flags and shaping his body into symbols. One of these signal stations was on the tower of Winchester Cathedral.

Late in the day of June 18, it flashed the signal: "—W-E-L-L-I-N-G-T-O-N—D-E-F-E-A-T-E-D—" As the message was given, a sudden cloud of fog made it impossible to read any longer. The news of the defeat spread quickly throughout all of London and the neighbouring countryside. The people overwhelmingly grieved and were disheartened at the news that their country had lost the battle.

Then, just as quickly as it had come, the fog lifted. The people now discovered that they had not seen the whole message. There were actually four words to the news flash, not just two. The entire message was: "—W-E-L-I-N-G-T-O-N—D-E-F-E-A-T-E-D—T-H-E—E-N-E-M-Y—" in no time at all, the good news was spread, replacing the bleak message that had circulated. Sorrow was turned into joy, and defeat was turned into victory.

It is similar with the cross. Today's message: "—C-R-O-S-S—D-E-F-E-A-T-E-D—B-Y—R-E-S-U-R-R-E-C-T-I-O-N—" May we always rejoice in the glory and victory of the cross.

Please join me for Mass at 7:00 p.m. on Monday to celebrate the Feast of our parish patron saint, St. Joseph. Normally, it is celebrated on the 19th however, Sunday takes precedence. Mass will be followed by a time of fellowship with some light refreshments.
