From the Pastor's Desk

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we proclaim, to all who are willing to listen, the infinite and divine mercy and love of God for every human being on the face of the earth. All we have to do is seek it. With St. Peter in our second reading let us praise God. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

In today's Gospel from St. John, we hear how Jesus appeared to the Apostles after they had locked themselves away in fear. When Jesus appeared, he began with these words, "Peace be with you." He then showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Risen Lord. Again, Jesus said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And with that he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

The story goes on to tell us that Thomas was not among the disciples gathered there and when the apostles told him they had seen the Lord he said, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger the mark of the nails, and my hand in his side. I will not believe."

About a week later Jesus appeared again to the apostles even though the doors were locked, and this time Thomas was with them, and Jesus began with the words, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." To which Thomas replied, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus then told Thomas, "Have you believed because you have seen me?" Followed by what I feel are extremely important words for us to keep in mind. "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believed." We, who call ourselves Catholics and Christians, some 2000 plus years later, are told that we are blessed, because we have embraced the truth of Jesus and believe. May our prayer for ever be, "My Lord and my God have mercy on me a sinner!" Yes, Jesus is Risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Ex Corde Foundation Grant Received!!

The ExCorde Foundation, established by Bishop Douglas Crosby, has an investment fund of \$20,000,000. Twice annually, the Foundation is open to applications from Parishes and Catholic Charities to apply for grants to complete various goals. A committee reviews the applications based on a variety of factors. An amount of \$420,000.00 had been allotted for distribution this Spring, and requests totaling \$1,188,441.00 were received in total. When it came to light that we were going to have to replace the Church's fire panel, a costly repair, we submitted a request.

It is with great excitement that we can announce that we have been awarded a grant of \$10,000 to help offset a large part of the impending expense. We are appreciative of this assistance from the ExCorde Foundation.

BISHOP OF HAMILTON

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Christ,

Next Sunday (the Third Sunday of Easter, April 23,) each Parish in our Diocese will hold a collection in support of the <u>Indigenous Reconciliation Fund</u>. This collection supports local initiatives of healing and reconciliation with our Indigenous brothers and sisters and forms part of the larger \$30 million national commitment made by dioceses across Canada.

In May of 2022, we held our first diocese-wide collection, asking for support that would add to the Diocese's original <u>\$4 million commitment</u>. Though the fund was new and had neither projects nor committee members, parishioners responded generously - contributing in excess of \$170,000.

Since this time, the Diocese has formed our local Indigenous Reconciliation Fund advisory council, whose members are tasked with the ultimate funding decisions for local reconciliation projects. This advisory council, comprised of four Indigenous and three Diocesan representatives, will be the main point of contact with those local Indigenous groups who will work toward the fund's four priorities: healing and reconciliation for communities and families; culture and language revitalization; education and community building; and dialogues for promoting Indigenous spirituality and culture. When the Holy Father met with Canadian Indigenous representatives last year, he remarked that, "any truly effective process of healing requires concrete actions." Your generous support does exactly this: it makes real the Church's deep desire for authentic reconciliation and serves as a tangible sign of the Church's closeness and fraternity with all Indigenous peoples. While the steps we take on this journey of reconciliation may feel small, they move nonetheless in the right direction. May the Risen Lord Jesus, whose resurrection triumphed over sin and death, guide us on this journey from pain to the hope of new life.
