## From the Pastor's Desk



Fr. Robert Hétu

In the last years of his life, the great cellist and conductor Pablo Casals suffered greatly from rheumatoid arthritis. At 90, he was badly stooped and his head pitched forward; his breathing was laboured. He needed the help of his wife, Marta, to get dressed in the morning. Marta would then help him shuffle into his studio where he would, with great difficulty, arrange himself on the piano bench. Casals would then manage to raise his swollen, clenched fingers above the keyboard. A visitor describes what he saw next one particular morning: "I was not prepared for the miracle that was about to happen. The fingers slowly unlocked and reached toward the keys like the buds of a plant toward the sunlight. His back straightened. He seemed to breathe more freely. Now his fingers settled on the keys. Then came the opening bars of Bach's Welltempered Clavier, played with great sensitivity and control. He hummed as he played, then said that Bach 'spoke to him here' – and he placed his hand over his heart. Then he plunged into a Brahms concerto and his fingers, now agile and powerful, raced across the keyboard with dazzling speed. His entire body seemed fused with the music; it was no longer stiff and shrunken but supple and graceful and completely freed of its arthritic coils. Having finished the piece, he stood up by himself, far straighter and taller than when he had come into the room. He walked to the breakfast table with no trace of a shuffle, ate heartily, talked animatedly, finished the meal, and then went for a walk on the beach." (Anatomy of an Illness as Perceived by the Patient: Reflections on Healing and Regeneration -Norman Cousins.)

Like music that inspires and exhilarates, the Spirit of God is the melody that energizes the Church, uniting our many different voices into the song of the love of God. God has formed us into a community, an instrument for bringing God's life and love into our world. Yet, what makes our Church more than just a gathering of good people? It is the 'breath' of the Spirit infusing the Church with grace.

Today, on the Solemnity of Pentecost, we celebrate that presence. The same Spirit, who Jesus, breath on the apostles that first Easter night, continues to 'blow' through the Church today giving life and direction to our mission and ministry of preaching the Gospel to every nation, which immerse all of humanity into the music of God's love and the symphony of the Resurrection.

#### Let us return with Joy!

May 24, 2023

Dear Friends:

For the past three years, the world has been shaken by the Covid-19 virus, and our lives have been changed as we sought to observe the many protocols which were established for our health and safety. These included frequent periods when we were unable to come together to celebrate our faith and be nourished by the Sacraments. On several occasions our churches were closed, and we were unable to celebrate the Sunday Eucharist, which is so fundamental to our Catholic way of life.

Since we foresaw occasions when we would be prevented from participating in Sunday Mass, and we were fearful of gathering as long as Covid-19 and its variants were spreading and threatening the health of so many people, on March 16, 2020, I dispensed the faithful of our Diocese from the obligation to participate in the Sunday Eucharist.

During the pandemic, several Parishes in our Diocese provided livestreaming, so that even though parishioners could not be physically present and participate fully in the Sunday Mass, they were able to at least hear the Word of God proclaimed and witness the celebration of Mass broadcast from their Parish. I am grateful for all the ways that our Priests sought to provide spiritual support to their parishioners during those difficult years!

In recent months, we have been able to resume most of our former activities. It has been a great joy to gather again with our families and friends, and especially with our Parish communities. At the beginning of this month, the World Health Organization declared that the Covid-19 virus is an on-going health issue; however, it no longer constitutes a public health emergency of international concern. Furthermore, all Covid-related restrictions have been removed in our Province. For this reason, I am removing the dispensation from the obligation to participate at Sunday Mass, effective on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), June 11, 2023.

I understand that some members of the faithful, for reasons of health, may not feel able to return to Mass. However, it has always been the teaching of the Church, that those who are impeded from participating at Sunday Mass because of ill health, or care for the sick, or some other grave reason, are not bound by the obligation to participate in the Sunday Eucharist.



Those who are now able to resume their regular activities and enjoy good health are obliged to participate at Sunday Mass. "Virtual Masses" online and on television, while spiritually helpful, do not fulfill the Sunday obligation for those who are able to attend Mass in person.

Today, on this Solemnity of Pentecost, we mark the conclusion of the Easter Season and celebrate the birthday of the Church. From the earliest days of the Church, Christians have come together on Sunday, the Lord's Day, to celebrate the Eucharist. And so, I take this opportunity to invite all the faithful of our Diocese, if they have not already done so, to return with joy to the Sunday Mass.

May our faithful celebration of the Sunday Eucharist and our reception of the Body and Blood of our Risen Lord Jesus Christ in Holy Communion never cease to nourish our faith and strengthen us to be missionary disciples.

#### **MEMORANDUM**

To: Parish Priests

From: Monsignor Murray J. Kroetsch, PH, VG, Chancellor

Date: 24 May 2023

Re: Removal of Dispensation from the Obligation to participate at Sunday Mass.

Upon the recommendation of the Presbyteral Council and at the request of His Excellency Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI, I am pleased to forward to you Bishop Crosby's Pastoral Letter for the Solemnity of Pentecost, "Let us return with joy!" which is to be read at all Sunday Masses in the Diocese of Hamilton on May 27-28, 2023. It may also be posted on parish websites and in parish bulletins.

I am also pleased to provide you with an update on the removal of all the COVID-19 protocols which have restricted our celebrations of the Mass and other sacraments during the pandemic.

Finally, included in this memorandum are some catechetical notes which can be fittingly incorporated into the homily on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) when the Dispensation from the Obligation to participate at Sunday Mass is removed.

#### **Removal of COVID-19 Liturgical Protocols**

All Covid-19 restrictions and associated protocols and guidelines related to the Liturgy are no longer to be observed. Therefore:

- The use of masks and hand sanitizers are no longer mandatory.
- Seating restrictions are no longer required.
- All liturgical ministers (greeters/ushers, altar servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of Communion, musicians) are to resume their service in the manner described in our liturgical books.
- The practice of ushers taking up collection during the offertory is resumed.
- The use of the credence table (away from the altar) is resumed; presidential prayers are to be said at the chair, and not the altar.

The privilege of the faithful receiving Communion from the Chalice is now permitted, where this is desirable and sufficient ministers are available. Both Communion in the hand and on the tongue is permitted. Deacons are to receive Communion from the Chalice, as prior to Covid. Communal celebrations of Baptism are now possible. Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – Homiletic Catechesis In addition to preaching on the Lectionary texts and reminding the faithful of Christ's inestimable gift of his Body and Blood in the Sacrament of the Eucharist – his real presence, it is fitting to remind the faithful that actual participation in the Eucharist by eating his Body and drinking his Blood is the pledge of eternal life. Such participation and Communion cannot be accomplished by "virtual Mass", but requires our physical presence, with the community at Sunday Mass. The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is also a fitting occasion to provide a brief catechesis on how to receive Holy Communion: Our communion with the Lord is also an expression of our communion with all those who have gathered for the celebration, and indeed, with all members of the Church. Therefore, the reception of Holy Communion is not a personal devotion, but an act of communion with the entire Body of Christ, head and members. The hymn we sing during the Communion Procession is "intended to express the spiritual communion of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to bring out more clearly the communitarian character of the procession to receive the Eucharist" (GIRM 86). We are encouraged to sing the refrain as we approach the minister. When approaching the priest or minister, the communicant makes a simple bow of the head (not a profound bow or genuflection). Common gestures express common faith. In Canada, the common posture for receiving Communion is standing. Common postures express common faith. Kneeling at this time expresses one's private devotion and can be dangerous for those coming to Communion next. When receiving in the hand, the communicant extends both hands, palms up, with one hand under the other (to make a throne for the King) and upon receiving the Sacred Host, responds: "Amen". The communicant immediately consumes the Body of the Lord. When receiving on the tongue, the communicant after saying "Amen" sticks out their tongue so that the priest or minister can place the Body of Christ on the tongue. We do not genuflect to the altar or the empty tabernacle after receiving Communion, since we have just consumed the Body of the Lord. After receiving Communion and returning to one's place, it is fitting to join in the singing of the Communion hymn. After all have received Communion, it is appropriate to observe a period of silent prayer.
