#### From the Pastor's Desk

The Battle of Milvian Bridge was fought between Roman Emperors Constantine I and Maxentius in AD 312. On the evening of October 27, with the armies preparing for battle, Constantine had a vision. A most marvellous sign appeared to him from heaven. The famous sign in the sky was a cross of light, with the inscription, 'Conquer By This.' At this sight he himself was struck with amazement, and his whole army also. which followed him on this expedition, and witnessed the miracle. Constantine placed the sign of the cross on the shields of his soldiers, and proceeded to battle, and his troops stood to arms. Maxentius was defeated in the battle, and Constantine was acknowledged as emperor by the senate and people of Rome. Constantine's victory brought relief to the Christians by ending persecution. 300 years before Constantine, God's sign appeared on the sky as a luminous star. It announced the Good News that a Saviour was born to free humanity from the clutches of evil. This sign was read by the wise men from the East. It led the wise men to Bethlehem and by God's grace, we know the rest of the story.

Like the wise men from the East, let us offer Jesus our gifts on this Feast of the Epiphany. Let us offer Jesus our gift of friendship with God in the form of wholehearted love and devotion; let us offer Jesus our gift of friendship with others by leading them to Jesus by our exemplary lives of Christian charity in action; let us offer Jesus our gift of reconciliation with God by daily asking God's pardon and forgiveness for our sins and giving unconditional forgiveness to those who offend us; let us offer Jesus our gift of peace by seeking God's peace in our own lives through prayer, the Sacramental life and daily meditation on the Word of God.


#### The Diocesan Wedding Anniversary Mass

- Organize fundraisers for council initiatives.

#### **Deepen Our Commitment to Social Justice**

Some ways in which we may deepen our commitment to social justice:

- Encourage participation in activities that uphold the life and dignity of the human person.
   Advocate for the complete inclusion in society and the church of the poor, vulnerable and marginalized.
- Advocate for the development of support services in the community.
- Promote stewardship for God's creation. Initiate/participate in letter-writing campaigns to politicians on adopted League resolutions.
- Request to be placed on the email/mailing lists of local, provincial and federal government representatives.
- Advocate for the dignity of work and the rights of workers.
- Recognize and uphold the principle that with rights come responsibilities.
- Encourage members to promote peace in parishes, communities, nationally and globally.
- Educate members about relevant social justice issues through guest speaker presentations.
- Study and implement the action plans of related adopted resolutions.
- Consider initiating a resolution on a topic of interest to the council (see Resolutions Handbook).
- Monitor legislation of social justice topics at various levels to keep abreast of ongoing changes in legislation.
