Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

We bring you greetings from your representatives of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul from St. Joseph and St. Mary's parishes.

Most sincerely, we thank you, the parishioners of St. Joseph and St. Mary's, for your extremely generous donations during these very difficult times. Our clients are very appreciative for your help. In total, for 2023, you have contributed \$40,988.00. As you all know this money is dedicated to help anyone in need living in our community, regardless of colour, race or religion.

We have visited a total of 103 families which includes 152 adults, and 105 children. Total amount of vouchers in groceries were \$15,130.00. Other expenditures (listed below)amounted to \$6,686.00.

Mission Store –Furniture, clothing Personal Hygiene Winter Coats for children to 18 yrs. Particular Council(Insurance & Dues) Groves Hub (For Snacks) Moving Expenses for a client Replace bicycles that had been stolen

We also contributed \$300.00 towards Bunk Beds and \$250.00 to equip each homeless person who lodge at Grace Gardens in Guelph.

We gave \$500.00 to St. Joseph School as contingency fund, and \$400.00 to St. Mary's for winter clothes for a family and \$400.00 to use as needed.

At Christmas we made a donation to all our clients for \$200.00 for food vouchers and these were handed out at the church.

We sent two students from our two schools to Camp Brebeuf and one student to Leadership for the amount of \$2,250.00.

As the number of families in need increase, we are appealing to our fellow parishioners, who may be newly retired and willing to help with home visits to consider

joining our group to ensure the continuation of the work that Brother Ozanam began in 1833. We meet every last Wednesday of the month at 4:00 P.M. in the Marian Room. If interested, contact the church secretary and she will put you in contact with someone in the group.

We sincerely ask that you keep us in your prayers so that we may continue our work with humility and compassion for our clients.


