#### From the Pastor's Desk

In expanding the Rosary with the introduction of the Luminous Mysteries (or the Mysteries of Light), St. John Paul II included as the second Luminous Mystery a meditation on the Wedding at Cana. (Last Sunday, we reflected on the First Luminous Mystery—the Baptism of our Lord.) When meditating on the occasion of the first miracle of Jesus, the Wedding at Cana, perhaps we may find it helpful to look at a picture of the event or listen to some uplifting music.

As our Gospel today recalls, Jesus, his Mother and his disciples were invited to a wedding in Cana. During the wedding feast the wine ran out. Mary turned to Jesus: "They have no wine." Jesus replied: "What concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." Mary said to the servants: "Do whatever he tells you." There were six stone water jars, each holding about a hundred litres. So, Jesus bids the servants to fill the jars with water, and then draw some out and take it to the chief steward. The chief steward said to the groom: "Everyone serves the good wine first...but you have kept the good wine until now." At his mother's request, Jesus worked his first miracle and it "revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him."

The Bible begins with one wedding, that of Adam and Eve in the garden (Genesis 2:23-24), and ends with another, the marriage supper of the Lamb (Revelation 19:9, 21:9, 22:17). Throughout the Bible, marriage is the symbol of the Covenant relationship between God and the chosen people. God is the faithful Groom and humanity is the beloved bride.

By the presence of Jesus and the working of his first miracle at Cana, Christian marriage was raised to the dignity of a Sacrament. Let us continually pray for God's daily miracles among Christian married couples and in our families.



#### #HEROESOFHOPE


Christian hope is rooted in Christ! Those engaged in parish ministries are heroes of hope for their local communities. They breathe life into their local parishes and foster hope in those who turn to the Church, seeking an encounter with Christ and encouragement and strength for their journey of faith. Parish ministries are many and varied, and are essential to the Church's mission to bring hope to our world. Here we highlight some of these parish ministries.



#### **Catechists and Evangelists**

Many of our parishes are blessed with gifted volunteers who share their Catholic faith with youth and adults alike. Our **catechists** prepare parents for the baptism of their children and support the foundational work of our Catholic schools by preparing young children to celebrate their First Communion and Confirmation.

Others participate as guides to adults and children of catechetical age who seek membership in the Church either by celebrating the Sacraments of Christian Initiation (RCIA) or by being received into the full communion of the Catholic Church. By announcing the good news of our salvation in Christ and the hope of eternal life, these parish volunteers lead people to understand our faith and learn to live the faith we share by participating in the Church's mission: to bring to our world the gift of hope, which does not disappoint.



#### **Parish Outreach Ministries**

In many parishes, volunteers provide hope to those in need, creating safe spaces for healing from separation, divorce, grief, and for parents looking for support as they face the challenges of their vocations.

In recent years, many parishes have expanded their efforts to include children and young adults, fostering environments where they can encounter Jesus Christ. Youth ministers guide young people in developing a lasting relationship with Christ and the Church, equipping them to face life's challenges with confidence, perseverance, and hope.

Additionally, dedicated parishioners from groups such as the Catholic Women's League, Knights of Columbus, and St. Vincent de Paul Society contribute countless hours to their communities. They raise awareness and funds to meet basic human needs, offering welcome and hope to those struggling with life's hardships. Through their active charity, they significantly impact the lives of those they serve.



#### **Liturgical Ministries**

When parishioners gather for Sunday Mass and celebrate the Sacraments, many liturgical ministers are engaged to ensure that Christ is encountered in the Word proclaimed, in the praise and thanksgiving offered by all, and in the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood.

**Ministers of hospitality** welcome us each Sunday, assuring us that we are not lone pilgrims on the journey of life, but members of a family who in Baptism have received a share in Christ's Death and his victorious Resurrection, the very reason for our hope.

**Parish lectors** faithfully proclaim the Word of God, week in and week out, and together with the priest or deacon, providing us with a sure guide to living as disciples of Jesus on our journey to our heavenly home.

Cantors, choirs and instrumentalists help us to respond to God's word and unite us in song as we seek to give praise and thanksgiving to God. Through their ministry they assist us to grow in holiness.



Our dedicated **sacristans** prepare and decorate the church to create a fitting environment for our worship. **Altar servers** assist the priest at the altar, so that he can reverently lead us in our common prayer.



Finally, our Extraordinary Ministers of Communion assist us to receive the Eucharist prayerfully and ensure that those who are unable to be present at Mass are united in communion with us.

In many of our parishes, catechists and leaders of **children's liturgy** accompany young children during Mass to hear and celebrate the Word of God. This is such an important ministry to ensure that children are initiated into the liturgical life of the Church.
