### From the Pastor's Desk

Several years ago, I was reading how it took Thomas Merton, the great monk, 20 years in a Trappist monastery, before her began to deal with his own inner violence. On August 21, 1962, he wrote in his journal: "Today I realized with urgency the absolute seriousness of my need to study and practice nonviolence. Hitherto I have 'liked' non-violence, as an idea. I have 'approved' it, looked with benignity upon it, praised it even earnestly. But I have not practice it fully. My thoughts and words retaliate. I condemn and resist adversaries when I think I am unjustly treated. I revile them, even treat them with open (but polite) contempt to their face. The energy wasted in contempt, criticism and resentment is thus diverted from its true function—insistence on truth."

If such is the case with Thomas Merton, it is most likely the same with us. Our following the non-violent Jesus requires the daily inner work of deepening non-violence. What a better way than the season of Advent, as it approaches, to look deeply at what is going on inside us and, when we are violent, to repent and then offer ourselves mercy. The more we show compassion toward ourselves, the more we will show toward our neighbours.

Remember Jesus did not retaliate 'violence with violence.' Let us be true instruments of peace and non-violence rejoicing in the victory of the Cross.

This week let us take time to remember those who paid the ultimate price for our freedom and security.





Jubilee Year of Hope November 2025

For Ministers to the Dying and Bereaved

**Heroes of Hope** is a monthly newsletter from the Diocese of Hamilton, shining a light on the extraordinary individuals and ministries who inspire hope and transform lives in our communities.

#### #HEROESOFHOPE

Life can be unpredictable and some situations, especially when a loved one is dying, require extra care and compassion. There are many in our Diocese who have made it their vocation to care for others during these times. These heroes of hope are there in the most vulnerable of times and help both the dying person and their family and friends to manage the unwanted situation. Their calm presence restores hope and helps everyone cope.


#### **Palliative Care**

Doctors and nurses who provide palliative care focus on relieving the symptoms and stress of serious illness. Their presence allows patients to live as fully and comfortably as possible until the end of life. They support not only those who are ill, but also the families and loved ones who share in the journey — true everyday heroes offering care and compassion when it is needed most.

"Hospice care not only helps people die with dignity, it helps them live out life with love."

#### **Hospice Care**

Direct support is offered to many through hospice care in our Diocese. These facilities provide a peaceful environment where patients and their loved ones can feel supported and cared for. They provide a space for people to experience their end-of-life journey with dignity and comfort in a place that feels like home. These facilities, such as **Emmanuel House**, **Margaret's Place**, **Stedman Community Hospice**, **Chapman House** and many others are supported by volunteer heroes from our Catholic community.



## Support for the Dying and their Families

Parish priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Communion make themselves available to bring comfort to those who are nearing the end of their earthly life. Whenever possible, they bring the sacrament of the Eucharist to those who are dying.

Priests celebrate the Anointing of the Sick, with prayer for strength and healing, and when possible, offer the "Last Rites" – Viaticum (Communion) food for the final journey. As the time of death approaches, priests, deacons and parish ministers may be invited to offer prayers for the dying, and at the time of death, the Church's prayer for the dead.

#### At the Time of Death

Priests, deacons, and lay ministers often meet with families to prepare the most appropriate way to celebrate the Church's funeral rites. These may include a first visit at the funeral home, a Prayer Vigil in the form of a Liturgy of the Word, the Funeral Mass or Liturgy of the Word, and the Internment. The importance of gathering as a community for prayer at these moments to remember and pray for the deceased is a great source of comfort and peace for grieving families.





In many of our parishes, volunteers offer support to grieving families with food donations and following the funeral liturgy, hospitality in the form of a funeral reception. In addition, prayers for the deceased continue following the funeral liturgy and Masses are offered for the deceased.

#### **Support for Those Who Are Grieving**

Grief is a natural response to loss. It's the emotional suffering people feel when something or someone they love is taken away. While loss affects people in different ways, many people find a need to find ways to help them deal with their grief.

In our Diocese, countless heroes of hope offer compassionate support to those in grief. Many parishes host the *When Life Changes* program, which combines educational guidance with a supportive group experience. Along with the Diocese, **St. Catherine of Siena Parish** in Hamilton, **St. Andrew's Parish** in Oakville and **St. Michael's Parish** in Waterloo serve as heroes of hope for the grieving.



#### **Spiritual Care for the Grieving**



Parish Support - Beyond formal grief programs, our parishes play a vital role in meeting the spiritual needs of those who are dying and those who mourn. Priests, deacons, lay ministers, and volunteers provide comfort and guidance in many ways, and continued pastoral care after a death. These acts of compassion, along with mourning rituals offered at the time of loss, bring solace and remind families that even in sorrow, they are not alone.

**Diocesan support** - Through the Family Ministry Office, the Diocese offers assistance to those caring for a loved one who is dying and to those grieving a loss. The office provides grief programs, referrals for complicated grief, and a variety of resources to support individuals and families. The office journeys, on behalf of the Diocese, with all those in need.



#### HEROES OF HOPE PRAYER FOR MINISTERS TO THE DYING AND BEREAVED

Lord God, by the grace of our baptism, you have given us new life in Christ and called us to serve as pilgrims of hope.
