The Third Sunday of Advent is Joy Sunday. On this Joy Sunday, I share with you these words from the late spiritual writer, Fr. Henri Nouwen, taken from Living In Hope—Advent Meditations.

Learn the discipline of being surprised not by suffering but by joy. As we grow old, there is suffering ahead of us. immense suffering, a suffering that will continue to tempt us to think that we have chosen the wrong road. But don't be surprised by pain. Be surprised by joy, be surprised by the little flower that shows its beauty in the midst of a barren desert, and be surprised by the immense healing power that keeps bursting forth like springs of fresh water from the depth of pain.

With a heart trusting that we will get what we need, and a spirit always surprised by joy, we will walk through this valley of darkness performing and witnessing miracles.

The common theme running through today's readings is that of joy, encouragement and the need for preparation required from those of us who are awaiting the rebirth of Jesus in our hearts and daily lives. A second common theme is witness. The prophet Isaiah, John the Baptist and Mary all bear joyful witness to what God has done and will do for his people. Filled with joy let us, "Rejoice in the Lord Always!" We pray, Lord, bless us with joy.
